Last legislative session, Texas lawmakers voted for new health care mandates that resulted in higher costs at the pharmacy counter for patients and hardworking families. HB 1919 takes away the ability for Texans to choose lower-cost pharmacies or convenient options like home delivery and makes it more difficult for employers to provide affordable health care to their employees.

- 70% of voters would rather go to a specific pharmacy for discounted prescription drugs than be able to pick up a more-expensive prescription anywhere.
- 84% of voters say lawmakers should lower prescription drug costs – not protect special interest profits.
